### GRAMMAR STRUCTURES CORRESPONDING TO VARIOUS CHILDREN'S LEVELS

- 1N Verb TO BE. Affirmative, negative & questions. All persons.  
Have /has got “ “ “  
Pronouns: Personal & possessives all (familiar with them if not using all)  
Questions words: what, what time, where, when, why, how many  
Auxiliary: Can & can't(ability) Do, don't. (passive knowledge at least)  
There is, are  
Article a / an  
Singular & plural of nouns  
Present simple affirmative and continuous. (what's he doing)  
Basic vocabulary: Colours, numbers 1 – 100, telling the time, clothes, animals, objects, food, days of the week, months and seasons of the year, jobs & professions, weather words, transport. Etc.
- 2N Revision & consolidation of N.1  
Verb TO BE (perfectly conversant with it)  
Have got “ “ “  
Auxiliaries: Do, does (questions & negs.) Can/can't for ability  
Present simple, continuous + (contrasting the two tenses)  
There is / are (questions & negs)  
Some, any, a lot.  
This/that These/those  
Going to.  
All the question words  
Prepositions of place – giving directions in street  
Must./ Mustn't/ let's  
Personal, possessive & object pronouns.  
Comparative of adjectives. (some superlatives)  
Past of to be (familiar with it)  
Vocabulary: for situations - describing, giving directions, inviting, refusing, shopping, etc

Countable /non count - some, any
